and found out we were neighbors.

Marcy: I can verify that.

Bob: What are your names?

Jasmine: I'm Jasmine.

Mo: And I'm Mo.

Bob: Oh, nice, I had an uncle named Mo!

Mo: In my case, it's short for Mohammed.

Bob: Gotcha!

Penny: What's your name?

Trix: Beatrix...but don't call me that, I go by Trix for short.

Penny: Oh yeah, I'm Penelope, but don't call me that either. I go by Penny.

Bob: And my name is Robert, but you sure don't want to call me that. I'm a Bob at heart.

Gary: Sooo, Zak, right? What do you wanna do?

Zak: You want to hang out at the mall again?

Gary: Sure.

Mo: Sure.

Tomas: Maybe I can hang out with our new old neighbors the Johnsons instead.

Dan: Nah, they went too. We introduced them to the Joneses.

Tomas: Wow, did they take some kind of party bus?

Dan: Nah, just three cars.

Tomas: Why did they take the one day I was away to do such a fun thing?

Dan: I dunno. Don't feel bad, they leave *me* out of literally everything. I mean, we probably just assumed that you were having fun visiting your siblings.

Tomas: That's true, I did have fun...I played Roblox with them. Dan: You think that's fun?

Tomas: Yeah.

Dan: (shrugs) To each their own. So, what do you wanna do?

Tomas: I want to give them a piece of my mind! (calls Marcy)

(At the mall)

Trix: Is there a bee around here?

Marcy: No, that's just my phone. I have it set on buzz. (picks up) Oop, it's Tomas. Hey, bro, I thought you were still visiting your siblings, what's up?

Tomas: Eh, I left. I played Roblox with them for 5 hours and that was all I could handle. Anyway, why did you pick today of all days to go on a mall trip?

Marcy: Well, to be fair, it wasn't my idea.

Starbucks Employee: Well, we do have matcha.

(A little while later...)

Starbucks Employee: Alright, here you go!

(murmurs of various thanks)

Jasmine: Where should we sit?

Melody: How about by that neat overlook? It has a great view of the

lower floors!

Mo: Nah, I have vertigo.

Bob: You're no fun. (sips matcha) Oh, this is bad. Next to literal dirt and...something I'm not going to talk about...this is the worst thing I've ever tasted! But I definitely don't want to waste it. Take it easy, Bob. Just pretend it's liquid medicine. (chugs it) Whew.

(Back with the kids)

(A girl walks by)

Zak: Look, a second potential patron! Hello!

Ashton (Girl): Hi.

Zak: Who do I have the pleasure of speaking with?

Ashton (Girl): Ashton.

Zak: ...Okay then. Would you like to see a cartoon for free?

Ashton: Sure!

Zak: Take a look!

Marcy: (gives a thumbs-up, even bigger grin) It's great!

Ashton: (chuckles) K, finished.

Zak: So-

Ashton: Here's my honest take - the drawings convey feeling pretty well but they could be a little more expressive. The storyline is innovative, but I'm not really sure what tone you're going for. Overall, I'll give it a B+.

Zak: Great! Thank you for your time.

Ashton: Of course.

(Zak gives a look to the other kids)

Trix: I think we ought to try somewhere else.

Gary: This place has good music, weird customers. How about we try the Lego store next?

Penny: But, why though?

(Meanwhile)

Dan: Hey, Tomas, I'm working on building a rocket. You want to help?

Tomas: STEM isn't really my thing.

Tomas: That's awesome, bro!

Dan: Eh, it's not great at the moment. But by the end, it'll be bien!

Tomas: You're not good at Spanglish.

(Back with the adults)

Bob: Hey, Mo, what kind of drinks do you like?

Mo: I don't drink.

Bob: What? That's impossible!

John: Hey, to each their own.

Caroline: So, Jasmine, what kind of parenting do you do?

Jasmine: Well, I try to put my kids' physical and mental health first. Number one - every day between 5 and 8 is family time. Number two - phones are only for calling and texting. Number three - if they want desserts, they always have to pay with their own allowance. How about you?

Melody: If one of my kids is mean to another, he/she has to do their chores for them.

Caroline: I just make sure they're not getting into inappropriate stuff. That's about it.

Jasmine: Wow, you're very hands-off.

Bob: Well, what do you all want to do next? I finished.

Caroline: Bob, the rest of us are still working on our drinks.

Mo: I've only taken three sips of mine so far. (off Bob's look) What? I'm savoring it!

(Back with the kids)

Trix: Well, let's test our luck here.

Zak: I have a good feeling about this.

Gary: Huh, they're playing "Sweet Dreams Are Made Of These."

Penny: Guess that's what people who like Legos are into.

Marcy: I never liked that song - it's got weird lyrics and not enough quitar.

Zak: Heyyy, what's your name?

Damian: Damian.

Zak: Would you like to see a cartoon for free?

Damian: Okay.

Zak: Feast your eyes on this!

Marcy: (emphatic thumbs up and giant grin) It's top-notch!

(Damian looks at it)

Damian: (sighs) Well...I can see that it's *trying* to be funny, but ultimately I'm not really sure what the point of it is. I think you need to work on your jokes. Watch a video or something.

Zak: Um...thanks for the feedback?

Damian: Sure.

(Damian leaves)

Marcy: Well, that was disheartening.

Zak: Let's give it one more shot. It's a group! Hiya, guys!

(It's Colin's clique)

Colin: Salutations! (Gasps) Look, it's Gary and Marcy! Fancy seeing you guys here!

Gary: Alrighty then! Let's pack it up.

Trix: Who are these guys? Marcy: You don't wanna know.

Zak: Then where do we go now?

Gary: Why don't we try Sephora?

Penny: Why would Sephora be a good place to share cartoons?
